Self-Directed Learning

"a process by which individuals take the initiative, with or without the assistance of others, in diagnosing their learning needs, formulating learning goals, identify human and material resources for learning, choosing and implementing appropriate learning strategies, and evaluating learning outcomes." (Knowles, 1975, p. 18)

Who is a self-directed Learner?

- Traditional Aged College Students
 - 18-24 years old often with limited life experiences, and sometimes limited responsibilities or barriers to learning
- Non- traditional Age College Students
 - 25 years old and older with varying responsibilities and life experiences that contribute to or take away from their learning

What constitutes online learning?

 Online courses are defined as a course where 80% or more of the content is delivered over the internet




Self- Directed Learners Online

Students are enrolling in online classes because of convenience

Enrollment has increased for online learners by approximately 50 % across the US since 2012

A large majority of students are underprepared and lack foundational skills needed to be successful in online classes.


Attrition rate is 10-30% higher for online learners in comparison to traditional classroom attrition rates



Are they ready for online learning?

- Assess , Assess , Assess
- Students should be assessed before enrolling in online courses and during the course.
 Students should also reflect on their experience after to determine if this setting is best for them.
- Assessment tools
- Online Learner Readiness Scale(OLRS)
- Self Directed Learner Readiness Scale (SDLRS)


Where are online learners?

- Lack of Motivation
- Self- Discipline
- Interdependence
- Poor Communication

External

- Technology Competence
- Language/Communication
- Cultural factors
- Socio Economic status

Fragile Online Learners



- Male students of African American or Hispanic origins
- Students from low socio- economic backgrounds
- Technologically challenged nontraditional learners
- Students who are not self-directed or intrinsically motivated

Institutional Support

- Provide the necessary resources
 - Technology, learning materials, and human resources
- Hire and train faculty and staff to meet the needs of a diverse group of learners (fund professional development)
 - Early intervention tracking systems – early alert
- Support students academically, socially, and emotionally
 - Varied students support services



Student Success Centers

Recruit and Assess Students Scaffold and Support


- Student Readiness Assessments
- Placement in appropriate classes
- Student Success Coordinators
- Advisors, counselors, mentors
- Institution and community resources



Faculty Support for students

- Course Design
 - Course materials and resources
 - OERs, textbooks
- Communication
 - Timely, honest, and sometimes empathetic
 - Varied locations and reminders
- Professional Development and a shift in mindset
 - Get to know students, learn how to meet their needs
 - Select self-directed online courses (Topkit and QM)
 - Cohort of learners

Instructional Design



- Include andragogical and pedagogical skills in lesson design (SMEs)
 - Know your student populations
- Student centered---- focusing on the needs of online learners
 - Tutoring/ learning videos, student academic support
 - Materials for visual, auditory, and kinesthetic learners
- Post academic reminders and non- academic information that supports the learner in multiple locations on the LMS
 - Provide examples and non- examples of required assignments

Self- Directed students should

- Develop time management skills
- Develop emotional intelligence
- Learn interdependence
- Form Cohorts
- Seek out mentors
- Assess and evaluate learning
- Make educated decisions regarding their learning

A concerted effort

- Not all students are naturally independent and self-directed in their learning
- It takes the help of faculty who are in direct contact with students to teach skills needed to be successful
- Various departments at the institutional level need to be more involved with online learners
- It is assumed that most online learners have the skills or technology it takes to be an online learner but this is not always the case.

Recommendations

- Provide all the necessary tools and materials you have available
- Do not assume all adult learners are where you expect them to be.
- Conduct formal or informal assessment of learners at the beginning of each course
- Be current with the needs and types of students because we are educating a diverse and changing student population
