Susan Hashway had a passion for many things--among them, research; the educational journal that her husband created and edited and that she published alone following his death; the symphony; and her lifetime profession as an educator. Having spent a major portion of her professional career at Grambling State University, she served there as Graduate Faculty and later as Coordinator of Developmental Mathematics. Sue had retired in recent years but left a legacy of active involvement and contributions to the field of Developmental education.
